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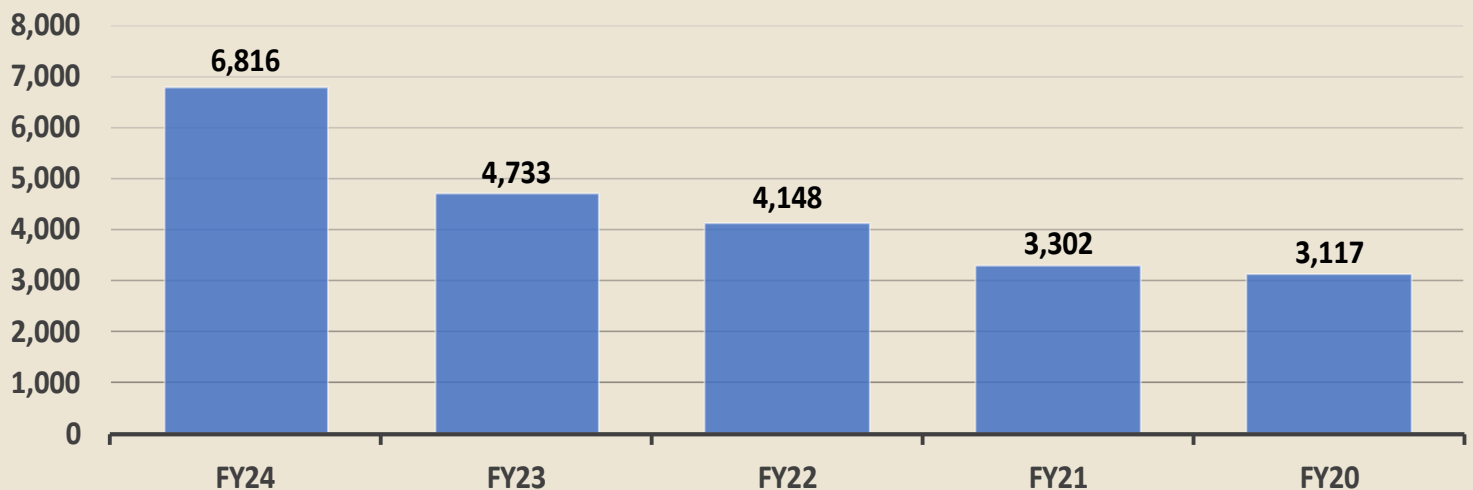

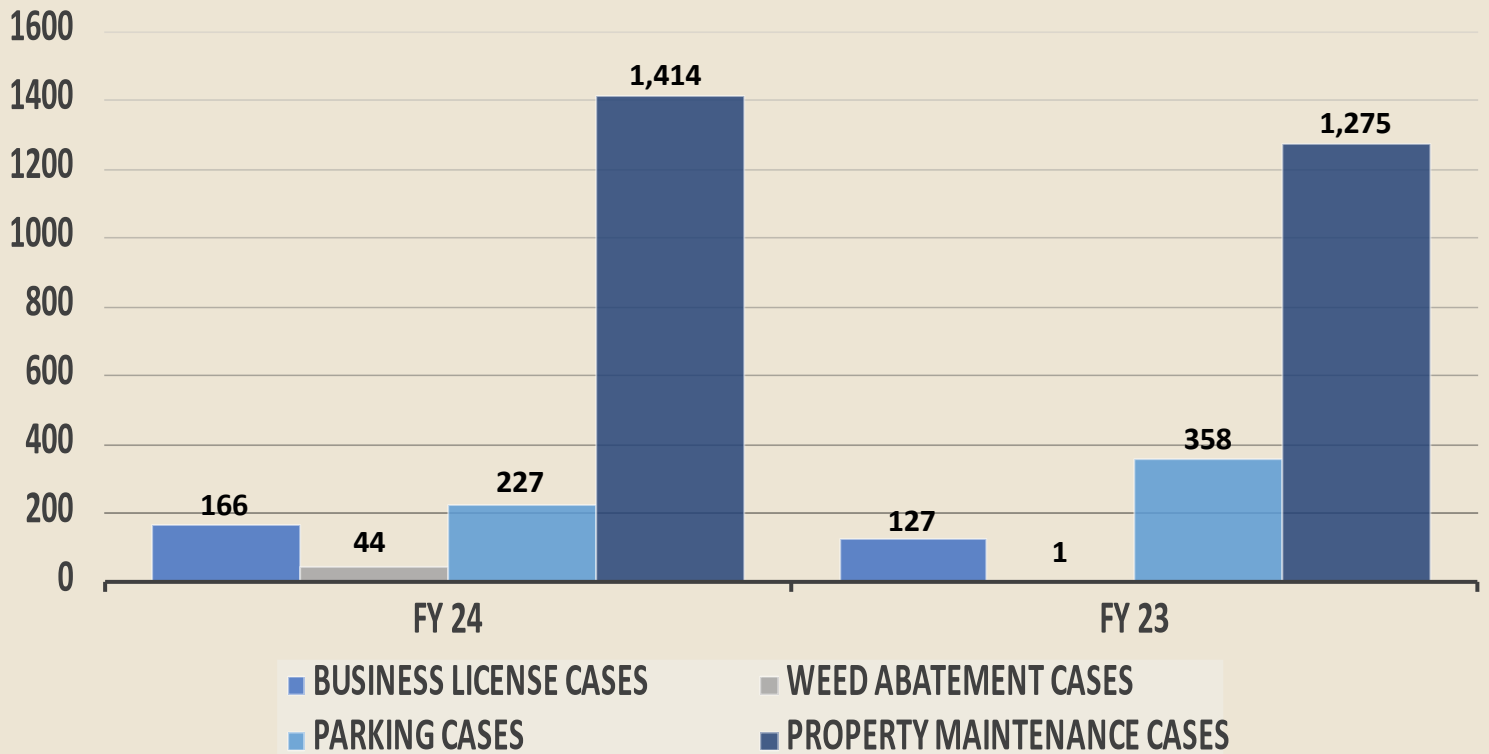

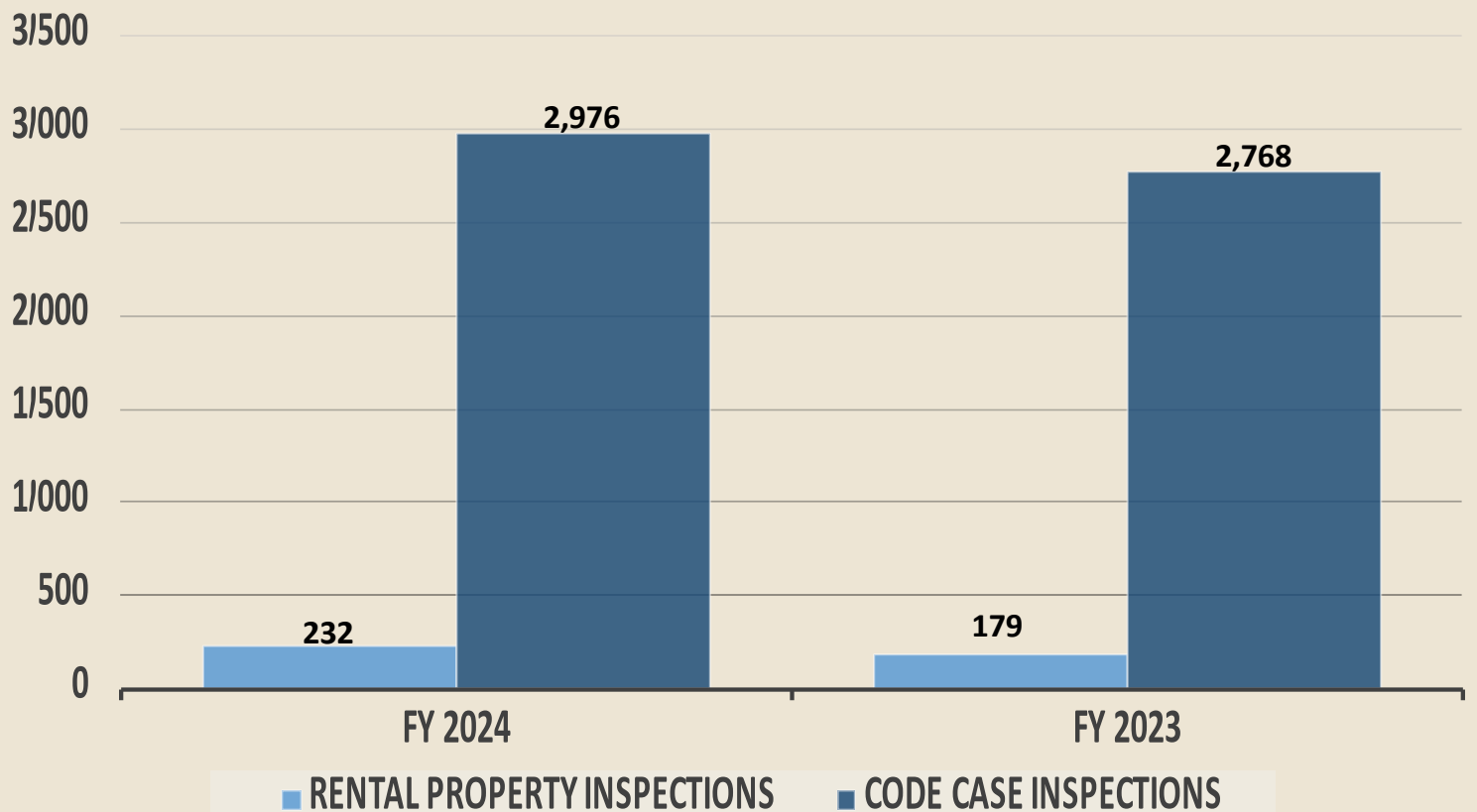


Case / Inspection Productivity Fiscal Years 2023 / 2024

CASE TYPE COMPARISON - QUARTER 4

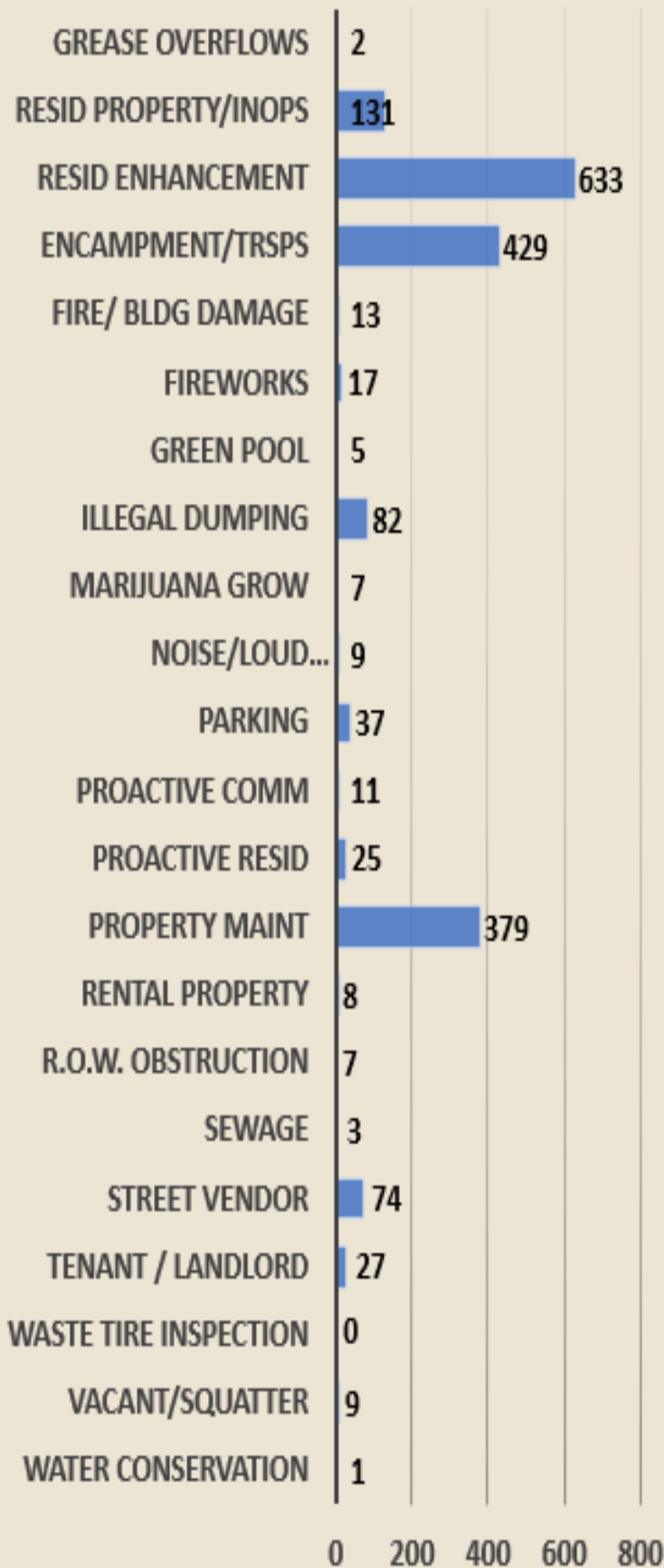


INSPECTION COMPARISON - QUARTER 4

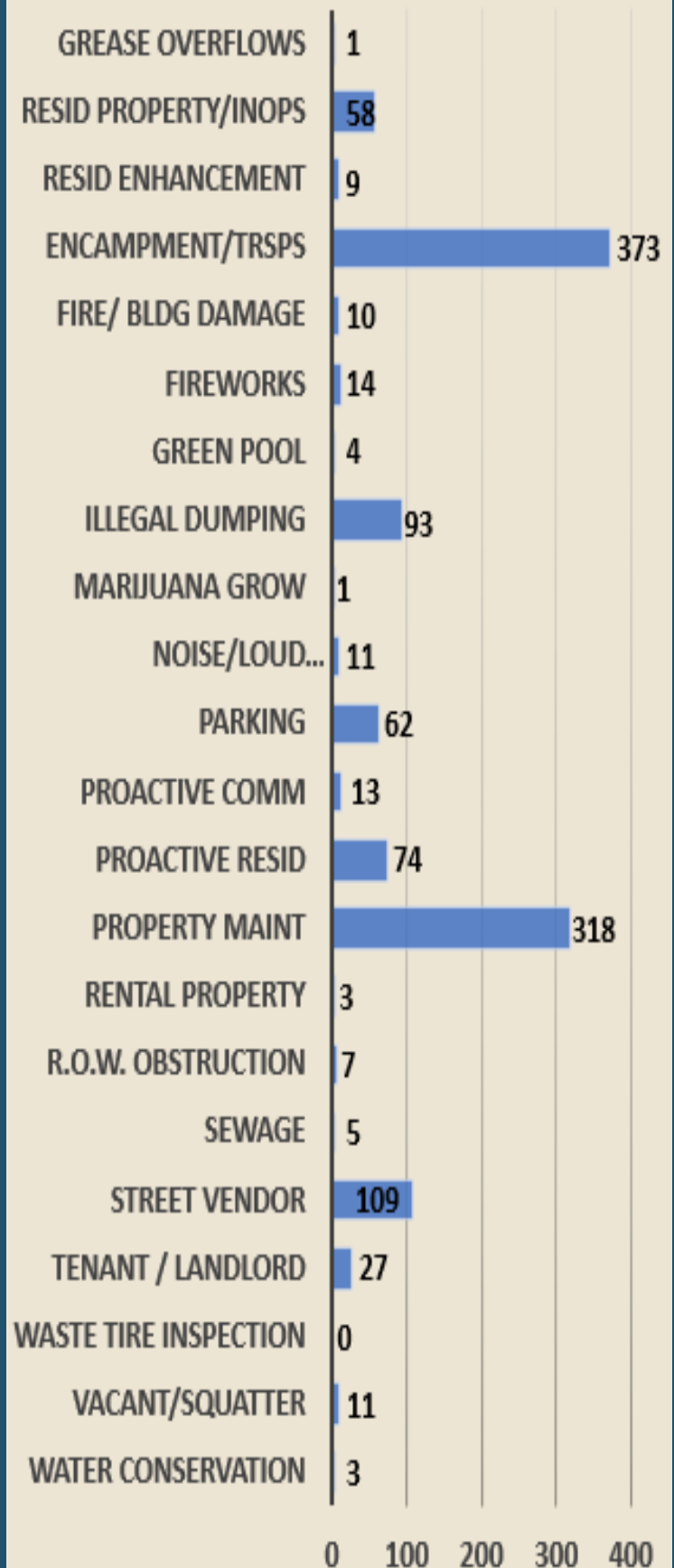


Case Classification Comparison Fiscal Years 2023 / 2024

CASE CLASSIFICATIONS FY24 QRT 4

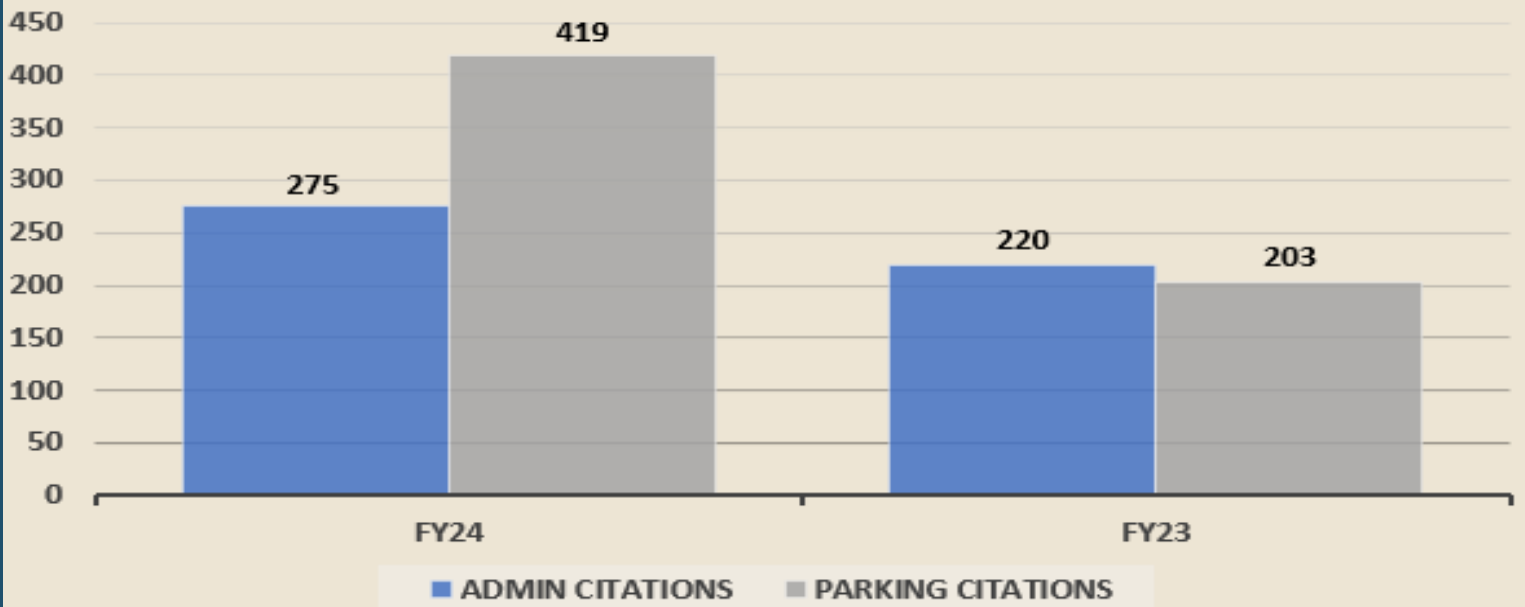


CASE CLASSIFICATIONS FY23 QRT 4



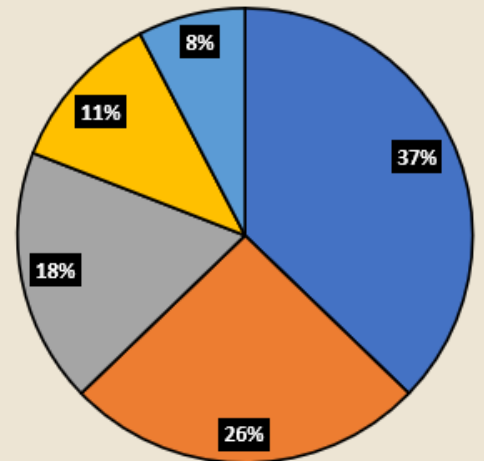
Citation Issuance Comparison Fiscal Years 2023 / 2024

CITATIONS ISSUED IN QUARTER 4



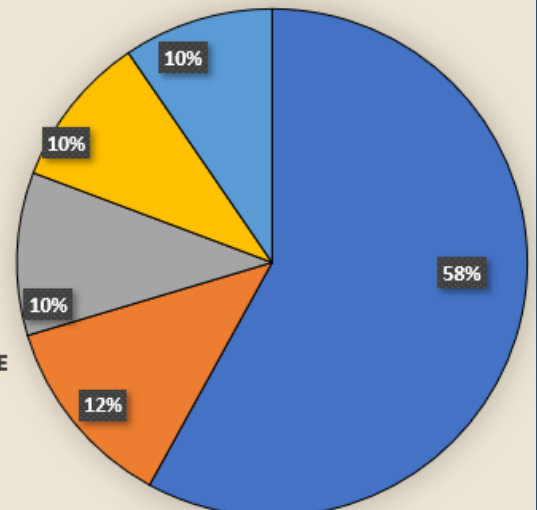

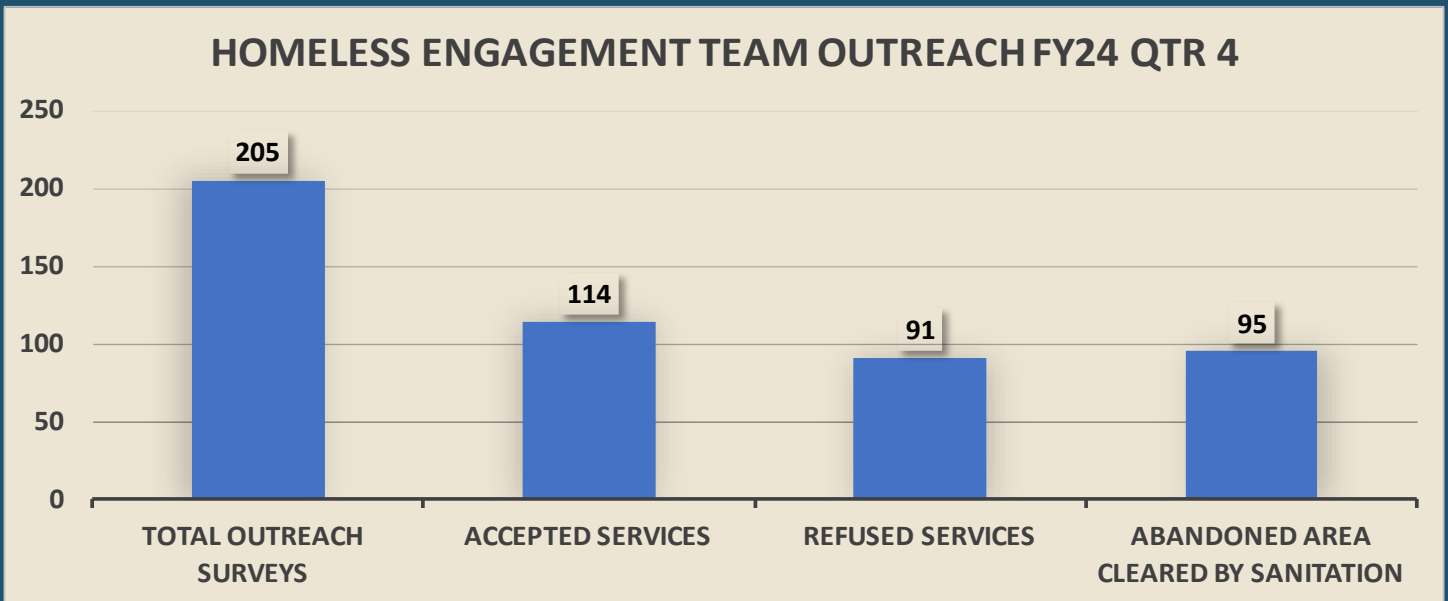

Anti-Camping Ordinance

On January 5th, 2024, The City of Victorville revised and adopted Municipal Code section 13.27 Storage of Personal Property in Public Areas and outlined enforcement and abatement procedures. The revised ordinance empowers the City's Homeless Engagement Team to offer shelter upon contact and continues with the City's compassionate approach to shelter people experiencing homelessness. Additionally, the ordinance provides added compliance mechanisms to expedite the clearance of conditions that create public safety hazards located within streets, sidewalks, parks, open spaces, waterways, public facilities or environmental and fire hazards within dense vegetation areas such as the Mojave River bed area.



City HET and Police Officers along with the Symba Center and City Sanitation Division staff conduct outreach efforts in the Mojave River bed area.

Homeless Engagement Team

Mojave Riverbed Clean-Up Project Fiscal Year 2023 / 2024

A comprehensive river bed clean-up and clearance was completed over multiple weekends support by Public Works, Sanitation, Community Services, Police Department, Code Enforcement, Animal Control staff members along with Wellness Center service provider -Symba Center.

Key Project Notes

- ◆ Total Staff Participation: 25 employees
- ◆ Total Tonnage Cleaned Up: 91.17 tons
- ◆ Project Length: 5/24/24—6/30/24
- ◆ Project funded by an Encampment Resolution Fund provided by the County of San Bernadino
- ◆ Access challenges required debris to be cleared manually using off road utility vehicles (UTV's).
- ◆ Effort consisted of pulling, raking, hand carrying, pushing, and breaking down extensive debris within challenging terrain.
- ◆ Despite high heat temperatures staff worked tirelessly to ensure the project's success and took great pride in positively impacting the area and improving the appeal of the beautiful Mojave river bed area.

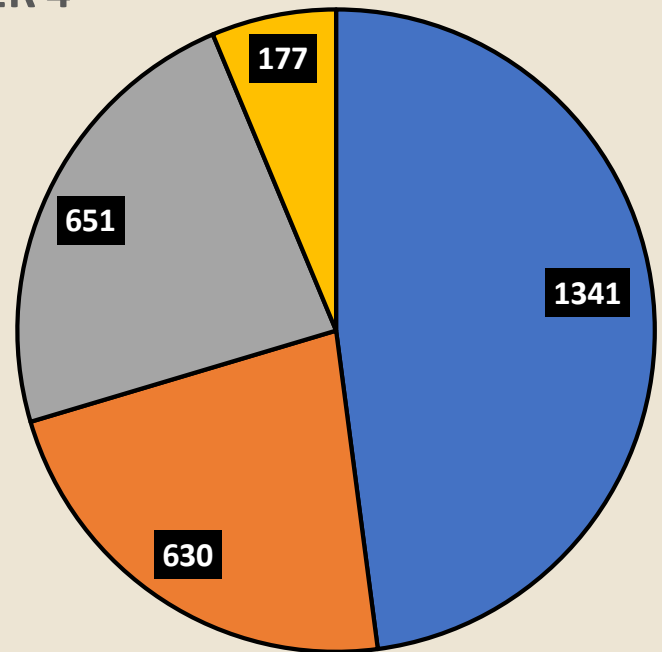

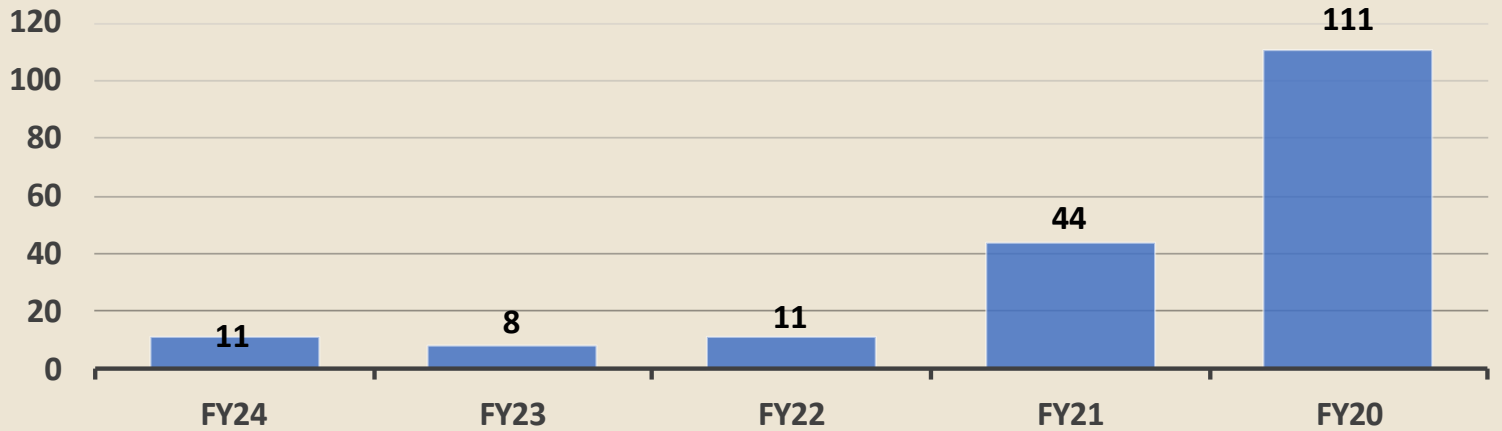

Special Compliance Tasks– Illegal Cannabis Cultivations

MARIJUANA ENFORCEMENT



Six new illegal marijuana cultivation sites were cleared through joint and swift compliance efforts between the deputies from the San Bernardino County Sheriffs Department, City Code Compliance officers, City Building inspectors, water service technicians and support from the City Attorney's office and Edison utility theft investigators. Fines were issued to responsible persons and properties were red-tagged due to illegal electrical bypasses and other hazardous alterations. The goal to reduce illegal cannabis cultivations continues to be successfully achieved through a city wide comprehensive- zero tolerance approach.
