





Inspections


In Q2, Animal Services conducted a total of **1,931** inspections, demonstrating their commitment to public safety and animal welfare. During these inspections, **91** citations were issued for animal related violations. This approach highlights the team's dedication to maintaining a safe and responsible community for residents and their pets.

Q2 Animal Shelter Intake




Administrative Hearings

Potentially Vicious/Dangerous Animal hearings were conducted for **nine (9) dogs** to determine if they were a public safety risk. As a result of these hearings, **five (5) dogs** were declared potentially dangerous, while none were deemed vicious. The remaining **four (4) dogs** were not classified as either potentially dangerous or vicious. These proceedings reflect the thorough and fair process undertaken by Animal Services and the Citation Processing Center to address public safety concerns while ensuring appropriate outcomes for each case.



ANIMAL LICENSING AND PROGRAMS



LICENSES

Licensing events are hosted monthly at the New Animal Care and Adoption Center providing an essential service to local pet owners. In the second quarter alone, **360** dogs were licensed, reflecting the community's commitment to responsible pet ownership. Licensing dogs not only ensures compliance with local regulations but also plays a critical role in helping the shelter and the City. Licensed and properly microchipped dogs allow the opportunity to return the pet to their owners if they become lost, reducing the burden on the shelter and allowing staff to focus resources on other animals in need. Additionally, to support our residents mourning the loss of a family pet, Animal Services will pick up a licensed pet at no cost.

MICROCHIPPING

Animal Services successfully microchipped **600** pets as part of licensing events, return-to-owner efforts, and license renewals. Microchipping a pet ensures that pets can be easily reunited with their families if they become lost and significantly reduces the number of stray animals entering the shelter. Microchipping supports pet owners by providing peace of mind, knowing their pets have a reliable form of identification. These efforts underscore the City's commitment to responsible pet ownership and improving animal welfare within our community.
