October 5th - Weekly animal adoptions at the High Desert Farmers Market began. Seven dogs were adopted at the first event and successful events have continued weekly.



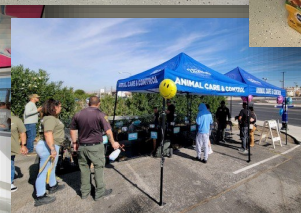

November 4th - Puppy Paw-looza Adoption Event. Animal Care & Control staff experienced an influx of puppies coming into the shelter. The Puppy Paw-Looza adoption event was a big hit with the residents and 17 animals were adopted.



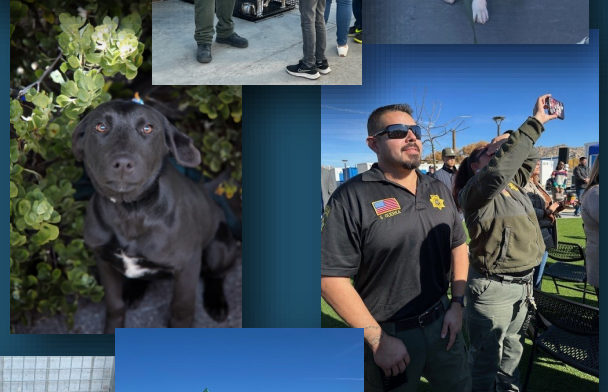

ANIMAL LICENSING

The State of Emergency Resolution for animal shelter operations was extended until the end of June 2024, allowing Victorville Animal Care & Control staff to continue to waive fees for first-time dog licenses to microchipped dogs.

Every Thursday from 8am - 3pm, at the Animal Control office on Amargosa Road, staff offer a free microchipping clinic for residents with dogs needing a microchip to take advantage of the program.

Since the Emergency Resolution was adopted, nearly 1, 500 dogs have participated in this well-received free new license and microchipping program. When an animal with a microchip is found, the data on the microchip increased the chance of reuniting the pet with it's owner by more than 73%.
